# Cat Personalities

Dr. Lauren Finka of the University of Lincoln in England recently interviewed nearly 200 people owned by cats. The study, documented in her book <u>The Cat Personality Test</u>, showed that cats basically fall into one of five personality types. Of course, a cat's personality changes over time due to experiences and development but the initial genetic personality never goes away, it just recedes in importance. The five personality categories summarized from Dr. Finka's book are:

The Human Cat loves their people. They crave human affection and attention and may be very vocal about it. They will share their home with you but will invade your personal space at will, maybe as a lap cat or allowing you to share their bed. Keep human cats entertained with wand toys, laser lights, or other activities you do together.





The Hunter Cat is a born hunter. It's in their wild DNA. Their hunting method is to stalk and pounce when prey emerges from hiding. Given access to the outside, they will often return with presents you probably won't appreciate. The hunter cat loves to sit motionless for long periods of time in a window or patrol a screened porch to stealthily watch the wildlife outside. They prefer realistic toys that allow them to stalk, run and pounce.

The Cat's Cat is comfortable with other cats. They are sweet cats who give care and comfort to other cats. They groom each other, give head bumps, and touch noses (kisses instead of hisses). They will curl up with and also play together. This personality trait does not frequently happen in the wild. Rather it happens when raised with other cats. These cats



like motorized toys that draw the attention of other cats. They also like cat towers.



The Cantankerous Cat is not very tolerant of being handled or touched. They are sensitive to their environment and seem always on the alert. They need their independence and distance and will be annoyed when habits are disrupted. Cantankerous cats choose their humans with care and will love them loyally, it just has to be on their terms. These cats need to have solitary play options such as toys to bat around and chase.

The Inquisitive Cat is always on the wrong side of every door, investigating something, or being some place that defies all logic. They are playful and outgoing and in addition to being



curious, they are very social and easily greet strangers. They like to play in empty boxes and bags. Puzzle boxes intrigue them.

We think there is one additional cat personality that Dr. Finka failed to mention: The Purr-fect Cat is that cat who lives with you!

They undoubtedly share many of the above personality traits and are thankful for your care and comfort. This is often shown by their loud and loving purr. We know of many "purr-fect cats" available for adoption at Second Chance. ~Carl Schafer

### Cats and Cardboard

Think of cats as little kids entertained by the simplest things life has to offer...like a cardboard box. Your kitty can jump into it, smack it with a paw, claw it, or push it around. Their obsession with boxes actually makes sense. Boxes come in so many shapes, sizes, and smells that they will think every new one is more exciting than the last one. Cats get comfort and security from enclosed spaces, which is why they love spending time in boxes. They are also natural predators and boxes provide the perfect space to hide, hunt prey, and feel safe.

Snug cardboard boxes fit the bill perfectly. Cats also like small, dark spaces as it helps to reduce their environmental stress, and as they don't have in built conflict resolution strategies, instead they prefer to



hide from their problems. A recent study conducted by the University of Utrecht discovered shelter cats that were given access to cardboard boxes recovered faster and adapted more quickly to new environments, which shows that boxes are incredibly beneficial in dealing with the anxiety of change.

According to a 2006 study by the National Research Council, the ideal temperature range for a domestic cat is 86 to 97 degrees F. That probably explains why your kitty enjoys soaking up the sunlight or sleeping in a body-heat-retaining cardboard box. Felines spend up to 18 hours every day sleeping so finding that perfect spot to snooze is so very important.

Don't be surprised to see your kitty having a good look when a new cardboard box appears. Not only are there new smells but cardboard boxes are made of the perfect material for your cat to bite, scratch, and soon shred to bits. How entertaining!

So there you have it. Boxes are both insulating and stress relieving comfort zones. Places where cats can hide, relax, sleep, and occasionally launch a sneak attack against the unpredictable people they live with. To your cat, no toy in the world, no matter how expensive or fancy it may be compares to a simple cardboard box. ~ Jackie Allison



# Aren't Cats Wonderful?

Crazy for Catnip

So, what is catnip anyway? Catnip is a member of the mint family. Nepetalactone, the essential oil found in the plant's leaves, can turn the laziest couch potato into a crazy furball. The intense catnip experience starts with the nose. Cats have an extra scent organ in the



Most cats react to catnip by rolling around, leaping in the air, rubbing their chins all over everything, sprinting back and forth, and eventually zoning out. Not all cats will respond to catnip. About 60% will go bonkers for this fragrant herb. Researchers have determined it is a dominant trait based on genetics. Also, it has been noted that both kittens (under 1 year of age) and senior cats are less likely to be affected by it. Don't worry. Used sparingly, catnip is not harmful for your feline. The effects can last around 10 minutes or less and then it wears off gradually.

Catnip is available in many forms. You can grow your own in a large pot or somewhere where you don't mind it spreading. Good soil and full sun exposure are required. The plant will bloom in mid to late summer. Offer your furry friend some freshly picked sprigs and dry some for a winter treat

sprinkled on their scratching post. Catnip loses potency over time. For maximum freshness, it is recommended to keep the dried herb it in an airtight container away from sunlight. Your cat will appreciate it. ~ Jackie Allison

# Do You Use Topical Creams?

Human medications that are applied to the skin can be dangerous for pets. Even tiny amounts of some topical drug preparations are toxic to dogs and cats.



Animals are exposed to topical medications by chewing a product tube, licking the product from a person's skin, licking their fur after being touched by someone with the product on their hands, or possibly by absorbing the medication through their own skin.

If you use any topical medications, be aware of the possible risk to animals. Keep all medications out of your pets' reach. Wash the product off your hands or wear gloves while applying it, and keep pets from licking skin and bedding that the product has touched.
